



Decompose the Number: Tens and Ones

Grade 1 - Medium

Look at the number. Write how many tens and how many ones.

Example: The number **34**: the **3** is in the tens place (= 30), and the **4** is in the ones place (= 4). So the answer is: **3 tens + 4 ones**.

(1) $21 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$

(2) $39 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$

(3) $23 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$

(4) $27 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$

(5) $60 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$

(6) $66 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$

(7) $24 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$

(8) $33 = \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ tens} + \underline{\quad\quad} \text{ ones}$
