Convert using $1 \text{ L} = 1,000 \text{ mL}$.

Multiply by 1,000 to convert Liters (L) to Milliliters (mL). Divide by 1,000 to convert Milliliters (mL) to Liters (L).

Example: $2 \text{ L} = \underline{2,000} \text{ mL}$

(1) $43,000 \text{ mL} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \text{ L}$
