Find the missing number to make fractions equivalent.

Example: $\frac{1}{2} = \frac{\quad}{6}$ → Bottom: $2 \times 3 = 6$, so top: $1 \times 3 = 3$ → $\frac{3}{6}$

(1) $\frac{1}{4} = \frac{2}{\quad}$

(2) $\frac{2}{5} = \frac{\quad}{10}$

(3) $\frac{3}{5} = \frac{6}{\quad}$

(4) $\frac{4}{5} = \frac{\quad}{20}$

(6) $\frac{3}{5} = \frac{\quad}{20}$

(7) $\frac{2}{5} = \frac{\quad}{15}$

(10) $\frac{2}{3} = \frac{\quad}{15}$

(11) $\frac{3}{4} = \frac{\quad}{20}$

(12) $\frac{1}{5} = \frac{2}{\quad}$
