Write the 4-digit number from the digit constraints.

Example: Thousands 3, hundreds 0, tens 5, ones 9 → 3,059

- (1) Write the number: 5 thousands, 3 hundreds, 1 ten, and 5 ones.
- (2) Write the number: 7 thousands, 2 hundreds, 2 tens, and 1 one.
- (3) Write the number: 9 thousands, 8 hundreds, no tens, and 3 ones.
- (4) Write the number: 3 thousands, 4 hundreds, 2 tens, and 1 one.
- (5) Write the number: 7 thousands, 4 hundreds, 3 tens, and 7 ones.
- (6) Write the number: 6 thousands, 2 hundreds, 6 tens, and 2 ones.
- (7) Write the number: 1 thousand, 8 hundreds, 2 tens, and 1 one.
- (8) Write the number: 7 thousands, 8 hundreds, 5 tens, and 8 ones.
- (9) Write the number: 3 thousands, 5 hundreds, no tens, and 2 ones.
- (10) Write the number: 1 thousand, 1 hundred, 2 tens, and 6 ones.
- (11) Write the number: 5 thousands, 8 hundreds, 4 tens, and 7 ones.
- (12) Write the number: 7 thousands, 2 hundreds, 7 tens, and 1 one.
