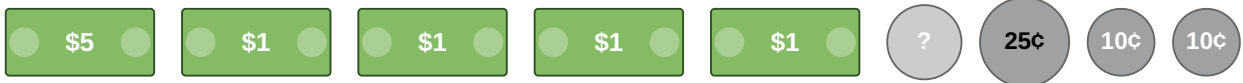

Solve word problems with money amounts.

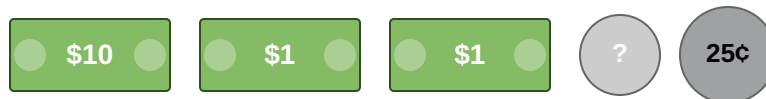
Add or subtract money amounts carefully. Don't forget the decimal point.

- (1) Sarah bought a book for \$8.75 and a bookmark for \$1.20. What was her total cost? 📖



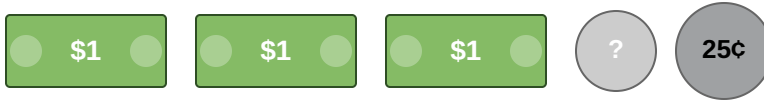
- (2) A baker bought flour for \$5.50, sugar for \$3.25, and butter for \$4.00. How much did she spend in total? 🧑🍳



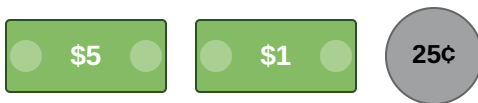
- (3) John purchased a toy car for \$6.80 and a small ball for \$2.15. He paid with a \$10 bill. How much change did he receive? 🚗

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- (5) A fruit stand sells apples for \$1.25 each. If you buy 5 apples, what is the total cost? 🍏



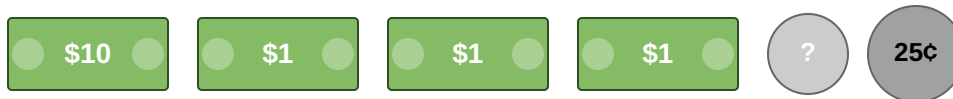
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- (6) Michael has two \$5 bills, three \$1 bills, two quarters, and five dimes. How much money does he have in total? 💰



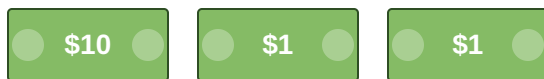
- (7) Lisa saved \$4.50 in week one, \$6.75 in week two, and \$3.00 in week three. How much did she save altogether? 🐷
