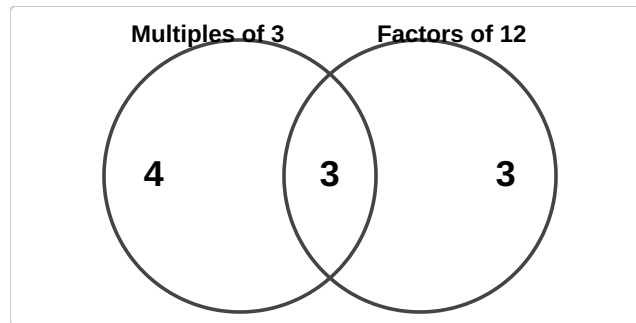

A Venn diagram shows relationships between sets. The middle part is for items that belong to BOTH sets.

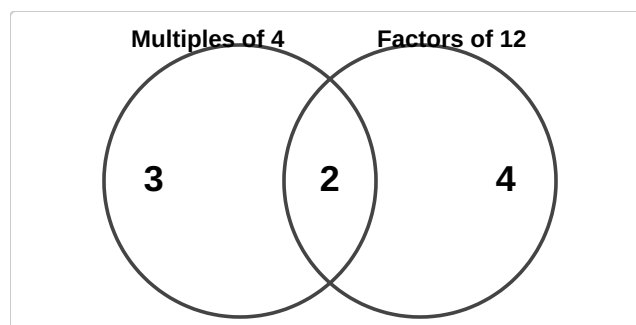
Example: Set A: Even Numbers. Set B: Multiples of 5. Where does 10 go? (C) Both

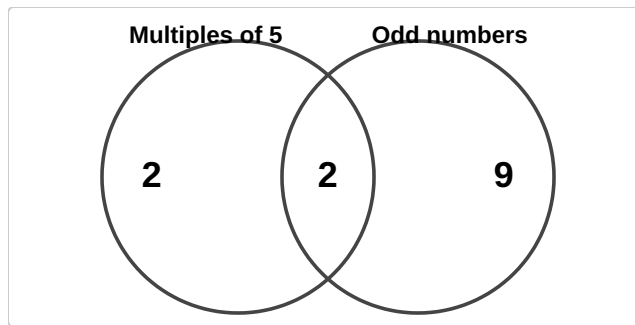
- (2) Numbers 1–21: Set A = Multiples of 4, Set B = Factors of 12. How many numbers are in "Factors of 12" only?

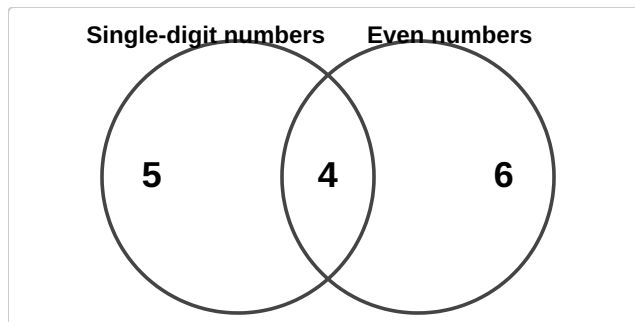

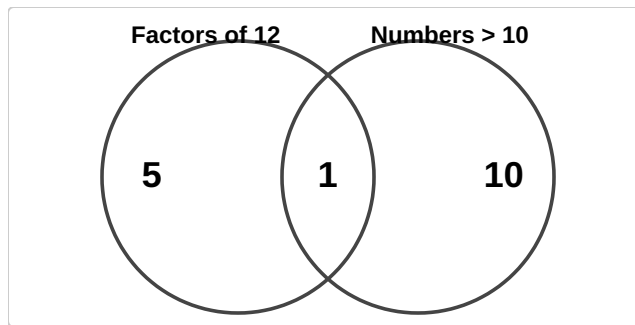

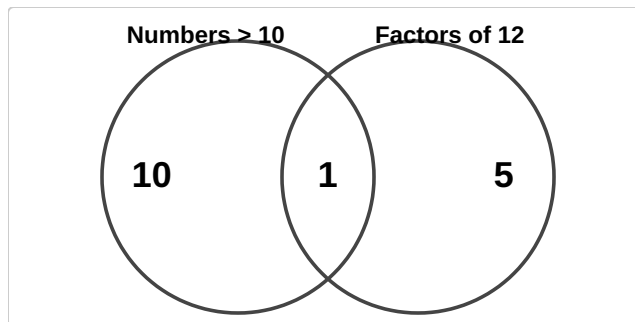

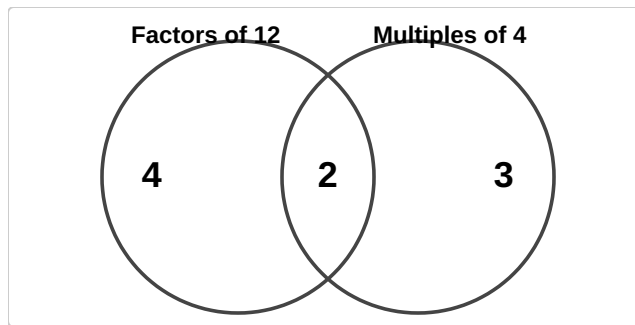

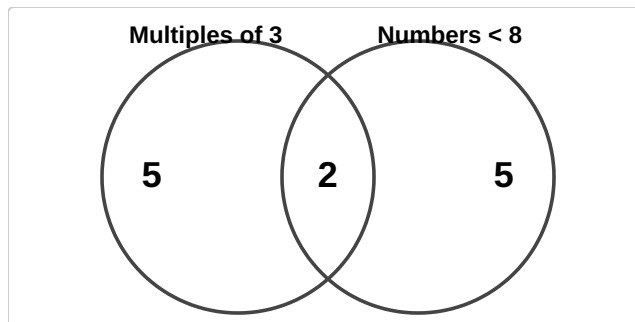

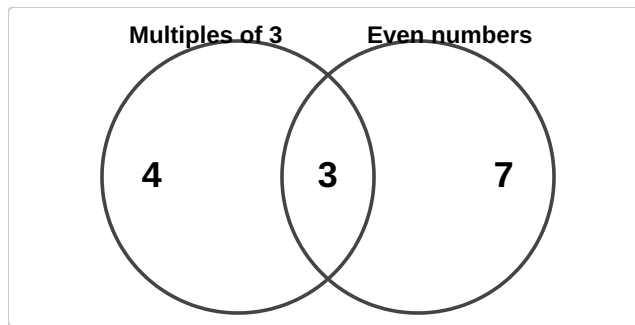

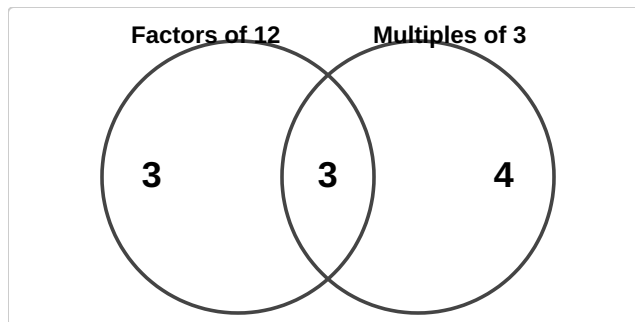

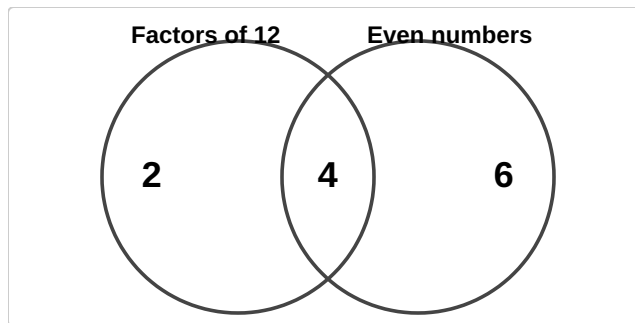

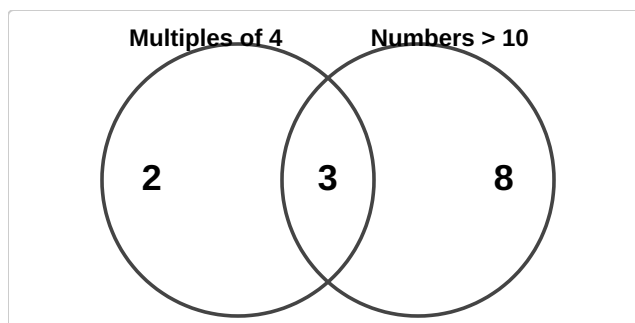
